





THE WORD OF GOD

THE FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 58:1-9a, 9b-12

SHOUT out, do not hold back!
Lift up your voice like a trumpet!
Announce to my people their rebellion,
 to the house of Jacob their sins.
Yet day after day they seek me
 and delight to know my ways,
as if they were a nation that practiced righteousness

WHEN I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written,

"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,
nor the human heart conceived,
what God has prepared for those who love him"—

these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

Those who are unspiritual do not receive the gifts of God's Spirit, for they are foolishness to them, and they are unable to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. Those who are spiritual discern all things, and they are themselves subject to no one else's scrutiny.

"For who has known the mind of the Lord
so as to instruct him?"

But we have the mind of Christ.

THE NICENE CREED

To receive the Sacrament, please come forward to the altar, kneel or stand and hold out your hands, one inside the other. The priest will place the consecrated wafer into your open palm. If you are receiving from the chalice, please — If you are able — take the cup into your own hands and sip from it. The rim of the chalice is wiped after every sip. **Gluten-free bread and non-alcoholic wine are also available**. If you require communion to be brought to you, please let one of the Welcomers know.



Announcing Southwestern Virginia's New Bishop-Elect

The Rev. Karin MacPhail, rector of St. Elizabeth's Episcopal Church in Roanoke, Virginia, was elected seventh bishop of the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia on Saturday, January 31 during an election held at the annual diocesan convention in Roanoke, Virginia.

MacPhail was elected on the 3rd round of balloting, receiving 57% of clergy votes and 54% of lay votes. A majority of both clergy and lay votes, on the same ballot, was needed for election.

"Today we give thanks for the guiding presence of the Holy Spirit in the life of this Diocese," said The Rev. Katherine Doyle, president of the diocese's Standing Committee. "We are grateful for the faithful discernment of our delegates and for the willingness of The Rev. MacPhail to accept this call to serve God's people in southwestern Virginia."

Lenten Gatherings


Throughout Lent, we will join Trinity to offer a series of activities to help mark the season: at the beginning, in the middle, and at the end of Lent.
