MEET THE REVEREND CHIP PREHN - The Rev'd W.L. Prehn, PhD, is a Partner of Dudley & Prehn Consultants, a firm specializing in boarding-school placement and leadership services for churches and schools. Dudley & Prehn works out of San Antonio and Charlottesville-area, Virginia. Prehn serves St. Mark's Church, Coleman, Texas, as part-time Vicar and is a priest-member of the Diocese of West Texas. Prehn was a parish priest and rector for twelve years before responding to the powerful call to begin school ministry in 1996. He served schools as chaplain, teacher, coach, and headmaster before teaming up with Brooke Dudley in 2020. He has served four Episcopal schools as a trustee. Prehn is a trustee Director of The Living Church Foundation, publishers of *The Living Church* magazine since 1878, and he directed the strategic planning process for TLCF in 2019-2020. Historian of education, journalist, and poet, Prehn calls himself "half Mississippian and half Texan but I was actually born in Palo Alto, California." Prepared at Chamberlain-Hunt Academy in Mississippi, Chip Prehn earned degrees from Texas A&M, Nashotah House Seminary, and the University of Virginia. Chip and Celia Prehn have three grown children, three interesting dogs, and live in Sisterdale, Texas, and Middlebrook, Virginia.
